

ONE NATION BRANDON TURTON - EMBRACED WHOLEHEARTEDLY BY FAR NORTH LOCALS

Brandon Turton, One Nation SA candidate for the Seat of Stuart, is a proud South Australian standing up for regional communities.

Following his recent visit to the Far North, Cooper Pedy on Sunday, and Roxby Downs and Andamooka on Saturday, Brandon said regional South Australians deserve better.

Brandon has worked as an engineer in heavy industry and understands firsthand the challenges facing mining, manufacturing and agriculture.

“Right now, families and small businesses across regional SA are being crushed by the cost of living, high power prices and years of government neglect,” he said.

“Too many people in regional communities feel like second-class citizens. Our roads and infrastructure are underfunded, our industries are struggling, and too many locals feel like they have been left behind.

“That is not acceptable, and it is why I am standing up”.

“I strongly support One Nation SA’s plan to help coastal communities recover from the algal bloom disaster. Recreational fishers play a vital role in local economies, and locking them out only hurts towns that are already doing it tough.

“I am also a strong advocate for lowering energy prices and making power reliable again. One Nation SA’s plan for a new coal-fired power station at Port Augusta is about protecting jobs and keeping industries like lead smelting in Port Pirie and steelmaking in Whyalla viable. Without affordable energy, these jobs simply will not survive.”

Brandon is calling on the people of Stuart to take a stand against government neglect and career politicians who put corporate and city interests first.

“I am here to fight for our communities, our jobs and our future, and to make sure regional South Australians finally have a real voice in Parliament.”

Arriving in Cooper Pedy on Sunday, Brandon said he found something special, a town built on grit.

“Built by people who endure the harsh desert heat, who adapt, who survive, and who thrive in conditions most would never choose. The resilience here is not just impressive, it is inspiring.

“That toughness, that independence, that quiet determination, it embodies the Australian spirit. It is the spirit One Nation SA stands for and fights to protect.

“This journey reminded me that our state is not just geography. It is people. It is character. And it is worth standing up for.”

Brandon visited the Old Timers Mine Museum and thanks Nicko Farantouris and George Rosewarne for hosting his visit.

“It was wonderful to see Cooper Pedy’s history so well preserved. The museum shows what this town was built on and why it is the Opal Capital of the World.”

He also travelled out to the Olympic Opal Field, where he observed the Bulovic family working with their excavator from atop a sandstone ledge.

“Thank you to Roger and Dean Bulovic, George Christianos, and George Rosewarne for their knowledgeable explanations and introduction to the various opal mining techniques.”

The Old Timers Mine was an eyeopener for Brandon, but he soon got the feel of early existence on the South Australian Opal Fields.



For lunch on Sunday the One Nation entourage attended the Cooper Pedy Shooters Club, where Brandon met with members over a pizza lunch and discussed a range of topics from local issues to general politics.

“It was very clear from conversations with residents at the Shooters Club that the regions have been neglected for a long time. Remote residents say they watch city politicians focus on shoring up future metropolitan votes throughout their 4 year term in office and showing very little interest in visiting the remote-areas.”

After the visit to the Shooters Club where Brandon participated in a couple of pistol exercises, the tour moved across to the RSL to meet more of the locals and enjoy a sausage sizzle.

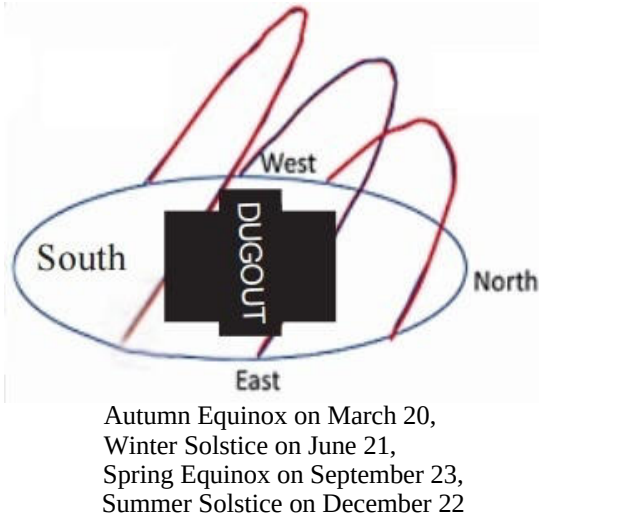

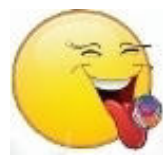

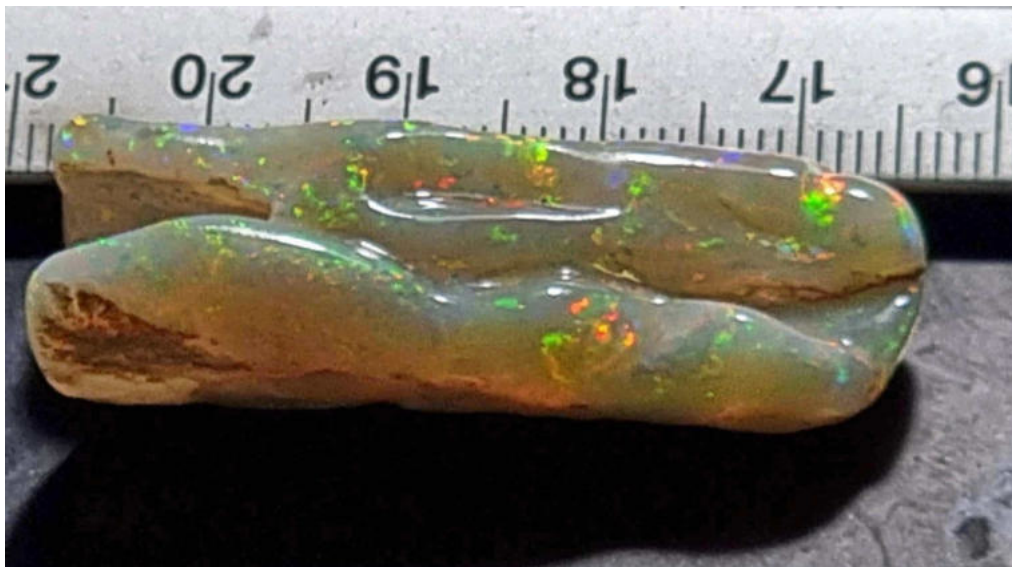

Disappearance of Gus Lamont declared a major crime



The disappearance of four-year-old Gus Lamont from Oak Park Station on 27 September 2025 has now been declared a major crime.

Police say this has been the largest and most intensive missing person search they have carried out. More than 160 police and over 230 other helpers, including SES, Defence Force, an Indigenous tracker and volunteers, searched the area for over 20 days.

Ground searches covered more than 95 square kilometres, including dams and mine shafts, and large areas were also searched from the air using helicopters, drones and aircraft. All of this material was reviewed by investigators using specialist software.

Despite these efforts, no evidence has been found to suggest Gus wandered away.

Police have also investigated whether Gus was abducted, but say there is no evidence of that. The investigation is now focused on people known to Gus who may have been involved in his disappearance and suspected death.

In January 2026, detectives searched Oak Park Station under warrant and seized a vehicle, a motorcycle and electronic devices for forensic testing. Police say further searches are likely as the investigation continues.

New Neighbourhood Watch campaign launched

A new Neighbourhood Watch campaign has been launched encouraging South Australian householders to improve their home security with the aim of reducing crime in communities statewide.

The campaign provides practical home security tips and directs people to the Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) website, <https://www.police.sa.gov.au/nhw/home> where they can access tools and information to help make their homes safer and more secure.

A key feature of the campaign is a 10-question home security habits quiz, <https://www.police.sa.gov.au/nhw/home-security-habits-quiz> developed to help users identify free changes they can make to improve their home security and reduce the risk of having their home broken into.

NHW State Coordinator Kirsty Mudge said the campaign built upon the success of the NHW SA program, which celebrated its 40th anniversary last year, by providing home security messages throughout the State, not just in areas with existing NHW groups.

“Nothing beats receiving face-to-face advice from a Neighbourhood Watch volunteer who knows your local community intimately, but there is a growing role for campaigns in ensuring everyone in the State can access reliable, quality crime prevention information that is easy to implement,” she said.

“Home break-ins can seriously impact families and individuals – from the cost to replace damaged items to psychological effects. We need to prevent break-ins from occurring.”

The objective of the campaign is to encourage householders to improve their home security to reduce crime and create safer, more connected communities.”

The campaign includes some lesser-known tips for making homes less appealing to potential intruders. For example, planting roses under your windows creates a prickly barrier for anyone thinking about breaking in.

“We know the cost of home security upgrades can put people off, so our quiz encourages householders to make small changes to their habits that can have a big impact on crime,” Kirsty said. “Simple actions such as locking doors and windows, securing valuables and being aware of your surroundings can help deter criminals.”

The campaign includes digital advertising, venue posters and letterbox drops to ensure the messaging reaches as many South Australians as possible.

Letter of Protest: Fair Treatment for Older Drivers

Dear Minister, Minister Emily Bourke MLC
We are writing on behalf of a large group of concerned South Australian residents to express our deep disappointment and frustration regarding the current driver's licence renewal process for people over the age of 70.

We believe that age alone should not be a reason to treat productive, healthy citizens as "guilty until proven innocent."

Many people over 70 continue to work full-time, run businesses, and support their families. Forcing drivers of heavy vehicles and motorbikes to undergo mandatory medical checks every single year from age 70, regardless of their health record, is an unfair burden.

The current policy of suspending a licence immediately if mail is missed or if a person is away on holiday is dictatorial and some are saying, 'threatening'. This causes extreme "stress and anxiety" for older residents.

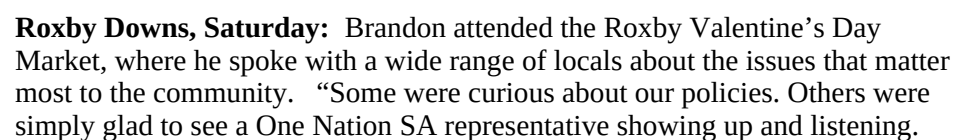
The "compulsory self-assessment" is seen by many as insulting. It interferes with a person's peace of mind and suggests they are no longer capable of monitoring their own lives.

Many residents are being forced to visit specialists, such as eye doctors, even when they have a clear history of excellent vision. This is a waste of time and money for the resident and puts unnecessary pressure on our healthcare system.

We ask the Government to review these policies and move toward a system that:
Respects Experience and focuses on health milestones rather than annual "blanket"
requirements for everyone over 70.

FAR NORTH RECORDS VARYING FEBRUARY RAINFALLS

Major rainfall occurred across the North East (NE) and North West (NW) Pastoral districts of South Australia between 7 and 12 February 2026, driven by deep tropical moisture from **Ex-Tropical Cyclone Mitchell**.

The following stations and locations recorded significant rainfall totals during this period:

NW Pastoral (SA)

- Mt Barry:** 112 mm (total for the 7 days to 9 am 12 February 2026). Note: 65 mm was recorded in the 24 hours to 9 am Saturday, 7 February.
- Tieyon:** 51 mm (recorded in the 24 hours to 9 am Monday, 9 February).
- Andamooka:** 19.8 mm (recorded over three days ending 9 February).
- Ernabella:** 29 mm (recorded in the 7 days to 9 am 7 February).
- Todmorden:** 37 mm (recorded in the 7 days to 9 am 7 February).
- Coober Pedy AP:** 1 mm (recorded in the 7 days to 9 am 7 February).
- Woomera:** 3 mm (recorded in the 7 days to 9 am 7 February).

NE Pastoral (SA)

- Arkaroola:** 100.6 mm (recorded in the 24 hours to 9 am Sunday, 8 February). Note: 87 mm of this fell in just 6 hours on Saturday afternoon, 7 February.
- Yunta:** 3 mm (month-to-date total as of mid-February).
- Moomba:** Severe weather warnings for 90–110 mm six-hourly totals were issued on 8 February.
- Simpson Desert /Dalhousie Springs:** Heavy rain from slow-moving thunderstorms was reported through Wednesday, 11 February.

Severe weather and flood warnings remained active for parts of the far NE Pastoral district through 12 February 2026.

POLICE ALERT – COPPER THEFTS



Hazards of copper thefts

February 2026

Police are issuing a warning to would-be thieves of the dangers associated with copper thefts.

The theft of copper, aluminium and brass is an enduring problem for public utilities and services, private companies, and the building industry. Typically, thieves target items such as copper piping, taps and electrical cables - items which are easier to dispose of and carry off building sites. Traditionally these types of offences are seen around new building developments, construction sites, vacated industrial properties and other sites.

Tampering with overhead and underground electrical systems can result in electrocution, burns and shocks from direct contact or ‘flashover’ from proximity, and other injuries from falls or explosions.

Underground lines present additional risks of causing gas leaks and explosions during excavation, while overhead lines pose dangers from working near them with heavy equipment, which can energize the ground.

Thieves are putting their lives at risk by interfering with live electrical assets. Perpetrators also endanger the community by leaving powerlines exposed. Recently, a man was electrocuted and died at Mallala and investigators believe the man was unlawfully on the premises at the time of his death.

Police ask the public to:

Be suspicious of people loitering around vacant premises, construction sites, communications pits and infrastructure, business premises and underground office car parks especially during hours of darkness.

If you own a vacant property, visit regularly and ask neighbours to report suspicious behaviour to police.

Be suspicious of people loading metal into private (non-work) vehicles.

Be alert to vehicles with their registration numbers obscured or missing.

Make a note of vehicle registration numbers and company names if the occupants are behaving suspiciously - even if this is at a work site.

Report suspicious behaviour and thefts immediately to police on 131 444.

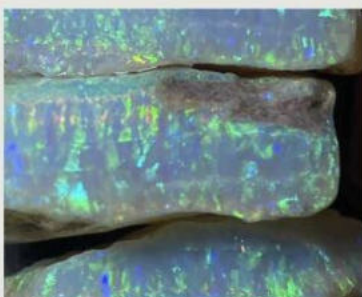

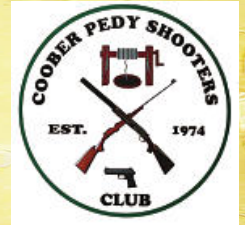
